## Pre-AP English 2 Lesson Plans April 13-17, 2020

This week we will be doing a little bit of grammar and proofreading (you just thought you were getting out of correcting the paragraphs)! I know that you are terribly excited! You can print the paragraphs or just write the corrections on a sheet of paper. I will provide the answer keys for the paragraphs so that you may check your work. Set 10 minutes on the clock, correct the paragraph, and take some time to see how you did. As you check, look up the grammar mistakes you made and correct them (you can look up the grammar rules online if you have access).

Monday, April 13, 2020

- "Insects Rule" (complete paragraph and sentence combining)
-write a grammatically correct 40-word simple sentence (explore 1 topic and develop layers of meaning)

\*for Free Write Friday, think of a place that has the mystery or beauty of a poem you. Go visit it if you can (you can do this virtually if it is a Carribean island or somewhere like this that you can find pics). List details that make the place like a poem to you (use colors, smells, sounds, objects, etc.). Add to your list throughout the week.

Tuesday, April 14, 2020

- "That's Entertainment" (complete paragraph and sentence combining)

-write a grammatically correct 60-word compound sentence (explore 1 topic and develop layers of meaning)

Wednesday, April 15, 2020

- "Rich and Poor" (complete paragraph and sentence combining)

-write a grammatically correct 70-word complex sentence (explore 1 topic and develop layers of meaning)

Thursday, April 16, 2020

- "Hardworking Bones" (complete paragraph and sentence combining)

-write a grammatically correct 100-word compound-complex sentence (explore 1 topic and develop layers of meaning)

Friday, April 17, 2020

-Free Write Friday (woohoo!)

-create a poem from your list

>do not name the place but create the images from your list (use all of your senses as

appropriate)

>be specifically generic so that you conjure a mysterious or beautiful place in the mind of your

reader

>the length of the poem is bound by the image you create
