1890 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The 1890 Scholarship Program sponsored by the United Stated Department of Agriculture (USDA) and offered through the Langston University School of Agriculture and Applied Sciences (LU-SAAS) was established in January 2020 and is part of an endowment to the 1890 land-grant university community. The purpose of the Scholarship Program is to support training of undergraduate students at 1890 land-grant universities (e.g. Langston University), resulting in degrees in the food and agricultural sciences and closely related areas as defined by the USDA.

At Langston University, there are three categories of 1890 scholarships. This application package is for senior high school students who maintain at least a 2.75 GPA, exhibit exemplary leadership traits, and participate in community service activities.

These full or partial Scholarships will be payable towards the successful students' tuition, room/board and fees on an annual basis, renewable based on academic performances and further reviews for the subsequent year. Additionally, the 1890 Scholarship recipients will be mentored by designated staff/faculty members who will work closely with the scholars to provide ongoing support and ensure the scholars are on track with degree requirements.

AWARD

Full or partial scholarships are awarded annually and must be used at LU-SAAS. The annual awards are renewable. Scholarship renewal is contingent upon satisfactory academic performance, leadership, community service, and progress toward the bachelor's degree.

After receiving the 1890 Scholarship, recipients must maintain at least a 2.75 grade point average (GPA) through the program of study at LU-SAAS, participate in regular advising and mentoring sessions, attend required meetings and events hosted by the University or LU-SAAS.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY

All applicants must:

- ✓ Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
- ✓ Be registered as a graduating high school senior
- ✓ Have a minimum cumulative 2.75 GPA at the time of application
- ✓ Be enrolled at Langston University as a full-time student
- ✓ Be majoring in an Agricultural Science or Family and Consumer Science discipline in LU-SAAS (Agribusiness, Animal Science, Crop and Soil Science, Natural Resource Management, Child Development, or Early Childhood Education).

Only completed application packages submitted by the deadline will be considered. All application materials must be submitted in one application package. All application materials must have original signatures and seals/stamps. Application materials containing photocopied signatures and transcripts will not be considered for the 1890 Scholarship Program.

Complete application packages must include the following:

- ✓ Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- ✓ A 300-500 word essay describing the applicant's academic interest and career goals. Also in your essay, include the following topics:
 - o Identify one important life challenge that you experienced and overcame?
 - What did you learn from that challenge and how has it impacted your drive for academic and professional success?
 - o If you are from an urban area or rural community, explain the nature of one of the main challenges that seem to be affecting the area?
- ✓ Current, official High School transcript with the school's seal and/or signature of an authorized school official
- ✓ Two letters of recommendation: one from a High School Counselor and the other from a High School Teacher.
- ✓ Signed and dated application forms, including the signature of the parent or guardian, if the applicant is under the age of 18.

Note: Applications with original essays will be considered highly favorable.
